Meet our Team



Kirven Douthit-Boyd

Artistic Director

Kirven Douthit-Boyd (Boston, MA) began his formal dance training at the Boston Arts Academy in 1999 and as a member of Boston Youth Moves under the artistic direction of Jeannette Neil and Jim Viera. Mr. Douthit-Boyd studied as a fellowship student at The Ailey School and on scholarship at the Boston Conservatory. He is a graduate of Hollins University where he earned an MFA in dance.

He began his professional career as a member of Ailey II from 2002–2004 and performed at Jacob's Pillow Dance Festival as a member of Battleworks Dance Company in 2003. In June 2004, Mr. Douthit-Boyd joined the Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater performing both nationally and internationally for 11 years. During his tenure with the company, he performed leading roles in works choreographed by Alvin Ailey, Judith Jamison, Robert Battle, Ron K. Brown, Geoffrey Holder, Jiri Kylian, David Parsons, Camille A. Brown, Ulysses Dove, Christopher Wheeldon, Hofesh Shecter, Twyla Tharp, Wayne McGregor and Ohad Naharin. He joined COCA-Center of Creative Arts in 2015 as Co-Artistic Director of Dance with his husband Antonio Douthit-Boyd. In 2016, Mr. Douthit-Boyd joined Ron K. Brown/Evidence, A Dance Company as a guest artist.

In 2010, Douthit-Boyd performed at the White House tribute to Judith Jamison hosted by then first lady Michelle Obama. He has also appeared as a guest artist in ballet and contemporary dance galas in Argentina, Mexico and Canada. He is the 2014 recipient of the "Black Theater Alliance Award" for his performance in Wayne McGregor's "Chroma," the 2015 recipient of the "Next Generation in Leadership Award" from the Freedom House in Boston, the 2016 recipient of the Boston Arts Academy's "Apollo Award" the 2021 recipient of the "Excellence in the Arts Award" from the Arts and Education Council in St. Louis, and the 2022 recipient of the Dance Teacher Magazine Award.

Douthit-Boyd has choreographed workshops for The Ailey School, The Juilliard School, Webster University, Boston Arts Academy, Boston Youth Moves and COCA. He has also choreographed works for Dallas Black Dance Theater and Ailey II. He is an ABT[®] Certified Teacher, who has successfully completed the ABT[®] Teacher Training Intensive in Pre-Primary through Level 5 of the ABT® National Training Curriculum and has completed Lester Horton Pedagogy studies under Ana Marie Forsythe in New York and St. Louis. He has also served as Distinguished Performing Artist at Washington University in St. Louis, where he taught modern dance in the collaborative MFA program between the University and COCA.



Erin Warner Prange Executive Director

Erin Prange holds her B.A. in Dance and Spanish from Colorado State University, and her Masters of Fine Arts in Arts Management and Leadership from Webster University. Between 2006 and 2018, Erin has danced for Fusionworks II in Providence, RI, aTrek Dance Collective, the Slaughter Project under artistic direction of Cecil Slaughter, and The Big Muddy Dance Company as a founding company member for 7 seasons. Erin has taught dance for 18 years for all ages- for the Boston public school district through the Topf Center for Dance Education, as a Trek Dance Collective's Education Program Coordinator, as a colorguard and dance team coach, and as the founder of the modern dance program at Dance Center of Kirkwood.

Since taking on the role of Executive Director for The Big Muddy in 2013, Erin has led the company to receive many recognitions, including two Theatre Circle Awards and a St. Louis Arts Award for collaboration. Erin was recognized on the Marquis Who's Who in America list for 2021, and currently serves on the Young Variety Board of Directors and St. Louis Forum.

Carly has trained in intensive programs including Orsolina28, Hubbard Street Dance Chicago, DanceWorks Chicago, the Martha Graham School, American Dance Festival, and the Kirov Academy of Ballet. Carly is an American Ballet Theatre National Training Curriculum certified ballet teacher for Pre-Primary through Level Five, as well as a 200-hour Registered Yoga Teacher through the Yoga Alliance. Carly joined The Big Muddy Dance Company's Trainee Program in 2017 before becoming an apprentice then company dancer. Carly has had the honor of performing in collaborations with organizations such as the St. Louis Symphony Orchestra, St. Louis Shakespeare Festival, Jazz St. Louis, as well as the Fashion Footwear Association of New York for their 2019 Fundraising Gala. Beyond her dancing, Carly is The Big Muddy's Director of Marketing and Communications, a freelance photographer, and a dance teacher at the Center of Creative Arts (COCA) and St. Louis Academy of Dance.



Brandon Fink

Director of Education

Brandon Fink is from Oklahoma City, OK and began his performance training in 2003. He developed his skills in the marching arts with Sarajevo Winter Guard from Siloam Springs, AR (2004) and Insignia Winter Guard from Dallas/Ft. Worth, TX (2005-2007). Brandon also choreographed and performed for Eclectix Winter Guard (2008) from Oklahoma City, OK and Central Independent (2009) from Edmond, OK. Brandon was a member of the Bluecoats Drum and Bugle Corps from Canton, OH (2005-2008). Recently, he has designed/instructed programs throughout the St. Louis area as well as The Cavaliers Drum and Bugle Corps from Rosemont, IL.

Brandon received his B.F.A. in Dance Performance from the University of Central Oklahoma. Brandon was a company member with MADCO (2011-2016), The Muny in Fiddler On The Roof (2016), Variety Theatre in Wizard Of Oz (2017)/The Little Mermaid (2018), Opera Theatre of St. Louis in Orfeo and Euridice (2018). He is currently a company member at The Big Muddy (2016-present) as well as an active member of AEA and AGMA.

Brandon's choreography has been presented at The Big Muddy Dance Company, University of Missouri St. Louis, University of Central Oklahoma, Florida Atlantic University, Oklahoma Contemporary Dance Festival, St. Louis Arts Alliance, American Dance Troupe, The Big Muddy Dance Company Trainee Program, and MADCO. Brandon currently serves as the Founder and Artistic Director for La Voûte Performance Ensemble and the Director of Education at The Big Muddy.

Leonides D. Arpon Rehearsal Director



(Filipino-American born in Israel) started dancing in 1987 under the direction of Rose Kassel at the Bat-Dor Dance School in Israel. He later joined their company 1998 under the direction of Jeannette Ordman and worked with choreographers such as Luciano Cannitto, Igal Perry and Randy Duncan.

He holds a Master of Fine Arts Degree in Dance from Hollins University in partnership with the former Forsythe Company in Frankfurt, Germany, is a recipient of the Princess Grace Award for Modern Dance and the America-Israel Cultural Foundation Scholarships.

Upon moving to NYC in 1999 Mr. Arpon was a principal dancer with Armitage Gone! Dance, Earl Mosley's Diversity of Dance, Kevin Wynn, Johannes Wieland, Sean Curran, Avila-Weeks and the New Generation Dance Company where he also trained in Argentine Tango.

In 2016 he continued to work in Japan for dance productions, performing art schools, coached celebrities as well as choreograph and perform in TV commercials for Panasonic, Toshiba, Mitsubishi, Gucci, Softbank, Nissin and DMM. He also studied acting at the English Language Film School Japan and Chubbuck Japan and appeared on Amazon Prime Video and NHK channels in drama series', talk shows and English instructional DVD's.

He also studies the art of creating dance for camera and shares his artistic experiences through community outreach with people of all ages and backgrounds.

Mr. Arpon has completed the Pre-Primary through Level 3 of the ABT® National Training Curriculum and the Beginner Horton Teacher Workshop with Ana Marie Forsythe.

He was assistant director for Earl Mosley's Institute of the Arts' "Hearts of Men" workshops in NYC and has taught around the world schools such as the Ailey School, Princeton University, and the Peridance Capezio Dance Center in the U.S. In Israel at the Bat-Dor Dance School, Thelma Yellin School of the Arts and Bikurey Ha'ltim. In Japan at the Tokyo and Osaka Schools of Music, Broadway Dance Center Tokyo, Yoshimoto Kogyo's Hinton Battle Dance Academy, Avec Grace Ballet and in the Philippines at Ballet Philippines, Philippine High School for the Arts and the University of the Philippines.

Mr. Arpon is thrilled to serve as Rehearsal Director and work alongside Kirven Douthit-Boyd, Erin Prange and the dancers of The Big Muddy Dance Company.

PROGRAMS

Education 2022 Educational programs

• **Trainee Program-** The 33-week training and repertory program, targeted for post-college age dancers that are preparing for a professional career, grew from 5 dancers in the 2021-2022 Season to 10 dancers in the 2022-2023 Season. The program includes performances on company Main Stage productions, community performances, outreach, and an eclectic mix of repertoire to be presented at two Trainee Showcases.



- **Elevate Student Project-** The Big Muddy held its annual Elevate Student Project in spring and summer of 2022, targeted for high school students (ages 14-18). Each of the specialized 7-week programs featured these young dancers in a premiere public performance.
- **Summer Intensive Programs-** In-person attendance was back up following the pandemic! Our younger students (ages 10 17) joined us for one week and our adult students (ages 18 and up) joined us for two weeks at our Grand Center studios. All three sessions presented their intensive's work in a black box showcase for friends and family.
- **The Big Muddy Dance Fest-** The September 2022 dance-filled weekend event provided many opportunities for dancers of all levels and ages. Master classes in ballet, tap, jazz, modern, contemporary, hip hop, yoga, Pilates, Afro-fusion, and more brought the dance community together in a collaborative series of programs and conversations. Other offerings on the weekend's schedule included Student and Professional showcases, a Regional University Audition, and seminars for Parents of Dancers and arts administrators.



Senior Embrace Outreach

Performances- In spring and fall 2022, the company and trainees visited a total of 32 retirement home facilities across Missouri and Illinois with genre-specific repertoire to trigger memories for senior residents and to create shared opportunity for conversation between seniors, caregivers, and dancers.




